SCHEDULE “LED-OL”

LIGHT EMITTING DIODE “LED” OUTDOOR LIGHTING SERVICE

Effective Billing Rendered June 1, 2026

AVAILABILITY:

Available in all territory served by the Corporation, in accordance with the Corporation’s Service Rules and Regulations.

APPLICABILITY:

Applicable only to outdoor LED lighting and poles conforming to Cooperative specifications. Service will be rendered only at locations that, solely in the opinion of the Cooperative, are readily accessible for maintenance.

REGULATORY FEES AND TAXES:

The billing, calculated as described in the Rate 1 Schedule of Charges for “RS”, shall be increased or decreased subject to the provisions of the Corporation’s effective Regulatory Fee and Tax Adjustment Schedule.

TERMS OF PAYMENT:

The bill is payable upon receipt. A 5% late fee will be assessed on unpaid balances after the due date. Further failure to pay a bill may subject an account to disconnection and charges in accordance with the Corporation’s Service Rules and Regulations.

TERM OF CONTRACT:

The Corporation may require a contract for lighting service.

SCHEDULE OF CHARGES (MONTHLY):

Total charges equal the sum of fixture charges in section A and Facility charges in Section B and C where applicable.

* When member chooses URD service for fixtures on wood poles when OH is the EMC preferred method of service, an additional monthly charge of \$4.00 will be applied or an additional up-front charge of \$185.

SECTION C- ADDITIONAL CHARGES

1. Where one (1) or more additional poles (lift poles) are required to provide lighting service at the location desired by the consumer, a non-refundable contribution-in-aid of construction as provided in Section (B) will be required.
2. The above monthly rates will apply only to fixtures and poles designated as standard equipment by the Cooperative. Contributions-in-aid of construction will be charged to cover the cost difference of other than standard fixtures and poles, provided the Cooperative agrees to install such equipment. However, at its option, the Cooperative may develop and offer a monthly rate for such non-standard pole and/or fixture, either in lieu of or in combination with any contribution.
3. Fixtures served by underground wiring will be available at the "FIXTURE" and "FACILITY" rates (excluding certain residential areas served by overhead distribution) in Sections (A) and (B) when the underground cable is buried in the same trench with the underground distribution system and the excess trench required does not exceed, on the average, 100 feet per fixture. A contribution-in-aid-of-construction will be charged amounting to \$1.50 per foot of the excess trenching over the base of 100 feet per fixture. Where underground wiring is desired, and paving or other obstructions exist, the customer will be required to perform all trenching, install duct furnished by the Cooperative, backfill, and complete the paving to the mutual satisfaction of all parties concerned. Roadway lighting requests received after the underground distribution facilities have been installed will require an aid-to-construction payment equivalent to the estimated excess cost above the normal same trench installation.
4. The consumer may be required to reimburse the Cooperative for any maintenance work which is required because of vandalism.
5. Where more than one luminaire is installed on a single pole, the rate for each luminaire will be the rate shown in Section (A).

SECTION D- CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

1. The Cooperative will furnish, install, operate and maintain the lighting equipment, including lamp, luminaire, bracket attachment, control device, poles and necessary wiring, electrically connected so that the power for operation of the light does not pass through the meter for the consumer's other usage.
2. The Cooperative will maintain the lighting equipment, including lamp replacement, at no additional cost to the consumer.
3. The lighting equipment shall remain the property of the Cooperative, including poles installed, when the consumer makes a contribution-in-aid of construction. The consumer shall protect the lighting equipment from deliberate damage.
4. The Cooperative reserves the right to specify the number and location of service points.
5. Lighting service shall be provided only at locations which are accessible to the Cooperative's equipment for servicing purposes. The consumer shall allow authorized representatives of the Cooperative to trim trees and shrubs as necessary for maintenance of the lighting equipment and for removal of the lighting equipment upon termination of service under this schedule.
